ONE: QUESTION THE CHALLENGES



During difficult times and without being aware of it, you might, due to desperate circumstances, retreat from those around you, including God.

Do you occasionally feel a lack of connection and that God is distant and silent in your prayers? Are you longing to be found but you have hidden yourself away so deeply that you have left no footprints leading to you? If so, this may imply that God is occupied with other priorities and too busy to look you up. Not so. "I am here for you".

Could it be that you are in default and too tied up with distractions to call in and say "Thank you Father, I know that was You".

God certainly does keep watch over you and we are told this: "The eyes of the Lord are in every place, beholding the evil and the good" Proverbs 15:3 (KJV). Here's an important point: not only does God hear your prayers, He understands your unspoken words. Especially those hard-to-express words that you can never voice loudly when you are in pain and sorrow. Those are sent by special delivery. From your heart to His hand. "I have them".

Isn't it awesome that you have a personal courier service that reaches from earth to heaven in a split second! Completely free of charge. No delays.

If you think that is exceptional then how about this: God collects your tears as well and He bottles them (Psalm 56:8). Why would He do this? Because He loves you that

much! He keeps you close to His heart. "I have heard thy prayers, I have seen thy tears; behold, I will heal thee" 2 Kings 20:5 (KJV). He says "Will". Not "Maybe" or "If I feel like it". You are a priority to Him. And yet, the terrain is harsh. The wilderness is frightening and the way ahead is intimidating and vague. You feel alone. Lost. Invisible. Every step you take is painful.

Close your eyes. Imagine your Father is standing before you with His arms open wide longing to embrace you as you grow weary. "One more step" He says "And another. You are almost here." And then, in a split second, you are enveloped into His love. "I've got you".

Those dispirited tears you express are very precious to Him. Each one that falls down your cheek in deep sorrow is captured. He clasps them ever so gently. God's love is the tissue that wipes away all anguish every moment of every day. The spiritual, physical and emotional are all connected. *One and the same.*

Memorise the above bible verse for continued confirmation of God's closeness to you as a reminder that you are always in His proximity.

It is however, imperative that you build a rapport with Him. While it is easy to simply cast your cares upon Him and expect a rapid response in an emergency because you have Him on speed dial, what are you doing in securing an eternal bond in your good times?

Where have you placed Him in your life – in the waiting room until you need Him now and again? What is your position?

How about on your knees in prayer.

Restore your faith journey and find the grace that only your Creator can provide as you walk into your destiny.

How do you acquire faith? "So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God" Romans 10:17 (KJV). The more you spend time with God the more your faith will increase because you will get to know Him on a much more personal level.

Ponder for a moment on some causes as to why you may have reached the point of despondency:

*Have you been going to extremes without taking a much needed respite? Slow down.

*Is it in your gentle repose to be a people pleaser giving more of yourself than you should? Take control.

*Are you being exploited because you have difficulty in saying no? Speak up.

*Do you overspend and waste money on irrelevant items and suffer from buyer's remorse afterwards? *(With financial issues there are two rules to remember: Increase your income or decrease your expenses).*

*Is your time taken up on non important things like scrolling social media for hours slowly causing anxiety? It is known to do this. Manage your online activity.

Take a look at all the factors that make up your lifestyle, including finances, relationships, career, environment and health. The answer to your setback may lie within any of these areas and require an adjustment as well as discipline for beneficial outcomes.

Identify what the most dominant issue is controlling your thoughts negatively and see if it is backed up with evidence to validate it. Perhaps you catastrophize every

event before it even happens and your default is fatalistic. You can alter your default.

Apply switched thinking where you redirect your attention and break unwanted thought patterns that you may have cultivated and gradually conditioned yourself into. If, for example, you repeatedly affirm "I am not good at anything", this can hold you back from releasing your true potential through doubt.

Reframe your statement to "I will try many different things and see where my talent lies."

Lord Alfred Tennyson said this "It is better to have tried and failed than to live life wondering what would've happened if I had tried". We all have wishes that we long to become a reality.

Before you place your request at the feet of your Father, ask yourself if it is an actuality that can be realized. "Delight thyself also in the Lord; and He shall give thee the desires of thine heart" Psalm 37:4 (KJV).

But what are your desires? And do they align with your values?

This might also be the opportunity for you to get out a notebook and start working on your plans. What areas in your life can you transform to boost your morale?

Be realistic about what it is you want to do and write that down. Set a date by when you would like to reach your objective and implement milestones to keep yourself on track.

Stay focused and controlled and be accountable to someone who can encourage you firmly. Keep revisiting

your goals and see if what you first had in mind remains unchanged.

You may decide to modify or tweak them as you explore other ideas. There is nothing wrong with this. It means that you are engaging earnestly and are confident enough to up your game.

When is a good time to get started on your action steps? How about "right now". Today.

TWO: **STEPPING BACK TO STEP FORWARD**



When you self-reflect with an honest, sincere approach and keep an open mind to comprehend plights that befuddle and trip you up, you will discover a lot about yourself. Perhaps incrementally you have covered layer upon layer of:

Abuse.

A negative self-image.

Unresolved issues.

Grief.

Every sheet added on top of the previous one eventually has the potential to suffocate and depress you further. Applying a band aid over a painful experience is a temporary solution. Getting to the crux of the matter may require a much more in depth analysis and exploration.

Maybe this is the time to unearth some of what is impeding you.

We often build restricting walls around ourselves like a fortified fortress without realising it, but this prevents progress.

Initiate working through unfinished business with guided help. There is exceeding joy in freeing yourself from the invisible, emotional and stifling chains that keep you prisoner. You are intended to be free – not in bondage and enslaved to your past.

Self sabotage is a stumbling block.

Rather than fabricating excuses to defer pressing issues, as many people do when their back is against a wall in problem solving - face them head on. Hoping a scenario will simply resolve on its own, or vanish if you ignore addressing the matter, will ultimately prolong your uncertainty.

When you are in a quagmire, give yourself permission to take time out.

It is a good idea to constantly reassess your current state of affairs before you are swamped so that you are aware of areas that appear to be struggling. This denotes you will be looking at issues proactively and able to reconfigure significantly easier.

There is reward with effort.

Aspire to become an active partaker and brainstorm ideas. Sometimes things may not be as unfavourable or unbearable as they first appeared to be once you decide to tackle them.

Take a step back to:

*Ruminate.

*Rest.

*Recalibrate.

*Reset.

God is in the business of resurrection and you are in His line of vision for growth and excellence. Maybe you are feeling disheartened that the plans you constructed long ago haven't quite merged as you hoped they would, but have instead, fallen apart. And so you have discarded them through discouragement.

Present them to God and let Him decide whether or not they should be laid to rest or if He wants to breathe new life into your dormant schemes.

Your desires may not meet the requirement of what He has in mind for you. Conversely, you might just be surprised and excited by what He selects for you to resume.

In your quiet time, try gaining an understanding of what patience and resilience means for you and how it can serve you well in other circumstances. When a decision is made in haste it may not have the preferred outcome you hope for.

A point to ponder on:

Many people in their later years have so many regrets because they kept putting things off till "tomorrow". They spend a great deal of time now thinking "If only I had".

Do everything in your power to live your life unapologetically so that when you look back you will say "I am at peace".

THREE: FINDING A MENTOR



Perhaps there are days when you feel that your strength and stamina have waned. Or you are feeling overwhelmed because you received news that you dreaded to hear. In an instant life as you knew it was altered forever.

Perchance you are unemployed or your living arrangements are in jeopardy. Could it be you have crippling pain or are a caregiver to a loved one with a terminal disease? Whatever it is, coping with tribulations in whatever form can sap your energy and bring you to the point of exhaustion.

Burnout occurs from unmanaged stress and can hinder you from carrying out your day to day activities productively. Be aware of warning signs.

Jesus said in Matthew 11:30 (NIV) "My yoke is easy and my burden is light", meaning you can find relief in Him. Mark 6:31 (KJV) has a beautiful verse "Come ye apart by yourselves into a desert place, and rest awhile". "Really? Am I allowed to do this?" Yes, you are. How does rest look for you?

Sometimes you can seek around for support only to find that you are on your own whilst spikes of anxiety disable you. Remember these words: "But the Lord stood at my side and gave me strength" 2 Timothy 4:17 (NIV). With the Lord alongside you, you will have a pillar of might to lean on. Strong and sturdy.

Let Him know that you are not managing. He longs to hear from you and that you are simply floundering from fatigue. While He is fully aware of your predicament, He wants you to speak to Him and pour your heart out. "I will get you through this".

It is easier said than done though to just hand over your worries. Do you find that to be true? You will be surprised to know that God delivers more than just a glimmer of hope in dire times.

He works in the unseen, today, tomorrow and forever.

Ask Him to place a mentor in your path to be your voice of reason. Consider these mentorships: Jethro and Moses, Eli and Samuel, Naomi and Ruth. There are some things you cannot accomplish on your own. Admit it.

In this selfish world, there are still many people who are kind, caring and obliging. Find your mentor. Or become a mentor to someone who you can guide, support and uplift through your own experiences. Could you do that?

Read the verses of Psalms. While God is the ultimate author of the Bible, this book has many uplifting verses written by King David (amongst other essayists). He too knew firsthand the perils of tragedy, sorrow, uncertainty and desperation.

But he also recognised that he was chosen for a divine purpose. David was a shepherd boy destined to be a King and lovingly described in 1 Samuel 13:14 as "A man after His own heart". The Lord saw David's values aligned to His.

You dear reader is also a man or woman who is in the heart of God.

In the book of Psalms you will find a great source of encouragement with the beautiful words expressed from someone who had been through all that you are enduring.

You may remember David for famously vanquishing Goliath with a sling and just one stone. He conquered his giant. So can you because you have a Father who fights for you also.

There is heavenly guidance through all your trials and ordeals as you bring your whole life to God in faith. He says in Psalm 91:4 that He will cover you with His feathers. There is a tremendous amount of comfort available for you. More than you will ever realise.

Alexander Maclaren says "True peace comes not from the absence of trouble but from the presence of God".

You are told in Isaiah 65:24 (KJV) "And it shall come to pass, that before they call, I will answer; and while they are yet speaking, I will hear".

Did you see this? "*Before* you call". God is holding your prayer in His hand in preparation and anticipation of your call. And *while* you are speaking, His attention is on every word you utter. The sound of your voice is music to His ears. "It is".

How do you conduct yourself before the One who is in a loving conversation with you?

FOUR: A HEART OF COURAGE



Fear has a crafty way of showing up to escalate anxiety and panic, especially when you are desperately trying to find solutions. Have you noticed this? Feelings cannot be trusted. They will come and go. They ebb and flow. Moods constantly change from one emotion to another.

Accept help graciously when it is offered. And lend a hand when it is called for. We all need assistance and reassurance now and again. It is ok to say I am not ok. It really is. There is no shame in admitting that you are vulnerable.

Take heart dear friend and consider that there is wisdom in calling on someone you know and trust who will walk alongside you as you traverse obstacles. Psychologists, Counsellors, Practitioners and Pastors as well as many reliable people in your circle are all part of God's grace for you. They may have advice you hadn't thought of.

These days many groups exist who will give you support during a crisis. Make enquiries and follow reliable leads you are given.

In John 14:16 Jesus said He will ask His Father to send a Helper who will guide and teach us. A great Counsellor. A Comforter. The Holy Spirit. The fruits and the gifts that He

Invite the Holy Spirit to live within your being and be blessed with His precious gentleness. Dr John R. W Stott said "The Christian should resemble a fruit tree, not a Christmas tree!" When it comes to self improvement, the Holy Spirit's character is vital to complete who you are. Daily ask for the fruits and gifts. Employ them in to your life in every aspect.

FIVE: **SURRENDER ALL**

Ask yourself: Is it a want or a need I have? There is a big difference between the two.

Perhaps you feel let down when you are ignored and your messages remain unread. That is a "people" thing and it is what they do.

God is not behind a screen.

We may be created in His image but unlike us in how we treat each other, He is respectful. He is kind. He is compassionate. Do you see those characteristics in yourself and everyone else?

You are designed to stick out rather than fit in. Everything you will need has been planted in you.

Because mostly everyone uses the internet for social outreach, you might be frequently notified of regular updates from those you interact with.

This can lead you into temptation of negative self evaluation where you may feel depressed and demoralised because your life doesn't appear as impressive.

There is merit in the saying "Not all is as it seems".

If you are not cautious when equating your personal progression to others, you could spiral into a downward loop.

Inwardly craving to be like someone else could lead you to bypass your own specialities. You have so much to offer this world.

should have no personal bearing on your capabilities. None whatsoever.

SELF REFLECT:

*Where do I see myself going forward?

*What do I want more or less of?

*What are my skills?

*Where are they able to be used?

*How can I improve on them?

Endeavour to cultivate your own distinctive path. You may just stumble upon an idea that no one else is contemplating. The world needs more variety.

Think about this, our lives have been transformed by some ingenious idea that was founded by someone who desired to try a diverse method.

Take for instance the humble light bulb invented by Thomas Edison who stated: "I have not failed. I've just found 10,000 ways that won't work." Thank goodness he kept trying otherwise we could still be in the dark!

Do you have an idea that can possibly bring about change? Work on it and see how far you can run with it.

Spend time in prayer and cover all your options in its entirety without being hasty or rushed. This is pivotal for a positive conclusion that will bring you peace.

When it comes to optimizing a result, bear this in mind, "If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you" James 1:5 (NIV).

Wisdom is the most treasured asset you can possibly acquire. Request it daily. It is an eternal gift to receive. A wise person knows what to do and through discernment will ensure that all will be done to the best of their ability.

Some oversights are difficult to reverse. When you are being pressurised to come to a resolution, regrets may occur. Take your time and think things through. If it means you have to delay for a short while on a decision, then so be it. Better safe than sorry.

EIGHT: MAP OUT YOUR PATH



If you happen to deem it laborious and vexing to reach your chosen goal because your vision is obscured by indecision and fatigue, then perhaps you should reconfigure your strategy and review your plan with integrity.

Consider however, there may also be occasions when you are influenced by the remarks from opinionated people who will cause you to question your choices and lead you in the opposite direction of where you want to go.

Refuse to be driven by the standards of someone who might not, in all likelihood, have their own life resolved.

There will always be sceptics in this world. Those people who are pessimistic by nature. It's best to circumvent being drawn into their way of thinking. Many of them can be your undoing.

Bear in mind though, constructive criticism can be helpful sometimes so avoid completely dispelling all viewpoints from others. Use common sense when engaging in dialogue and once again, research all matter you are presented with. You might just unearth a gem!

Oftentimes your inner voice or "hunch" may well be credible. Listen to yourself.

Or, perhaps you lack confidence and have an aversion to defeat and opt to "play it safe". This can happen but

always be cognizant that there is zero growth in a comfort zone.

Doubt is a barrier that will prevent you from forging ahead if you give it your consent. There are of course times when you need to question the motive behind feeling disinclined.

Even the most successful people experience dubiety now and again.

If disempowering thoughts control every essence of your life in the negative, then you need to tackle them realistically. Emotions are God given. But sometimes they can run amok if not managed and controlled.

Perhaps you are a procrastinator and you find it difficult to either start or maintain your goal. If that is the case, then bring someone on board who will motivate you.

How many unfinished projects do you have?

- *The book you said you want to write
- *The rooms you were going to de-clutter
- *The phone call you keep putting off
- *The person you promised to visit
- *The musical instrument you desired to learn

The above are just examples. Compile your own "to do list" and work through each item ticking off "done" as you complete your task. You will be surprised at your progress.

Consider what Winston Churchill said "Success is not final, failure is not fatal: It is the courage to continue that counts".

Following the crowd and emulating what they do, could leave you feeling dissatisfied and unfulfilled. What is

trendy today becomes old news tomorrow. Build your own empire and then successfully guide others to prosper.

Lead by excellent example.

A point to ponder: Humans (yes, that's us) are in perpetual motion. We are constantly in a developmental stage. Provided you are moving forward proactively, that in itself is marvellous and outstanding. Good for you. Keep going!

We read these sage words "In all your ways submit to Him, and He will make your paths straight" Proverbs 3:6 (NIV). You walk, He directs your paths. But you need to know where you are walking to.

As a side note: The book of Proverbs is filled with comprehensive insight covering every topic you will ever encounter. There are 31 chapters – one for every day of the month. Memorise pertinent verses to recite for when you are facing adversity.

When Alice from "Alice Through The Looking Glass" (CS Lewis) asked the Cheshire cat which way she ought to go, the cat responded "That depends a good deal on where you want to get to". Alice replied "I don't much care where". The cat said "Then it doesn't matter which way you go".

Plot your path wisely otherwise you may not reach your destination effectively and it could take you a lot longer than you planned. Review your map regularly as you traverse.

Place God in the driving seat while you become the active passenger who shares with Him where you would like to go in life. He may take you in a slightly different

direction and this is just fine. Collaborate with Him; show Him your chart going forwards. And if He should erase any of your coordinates, let Him do so.

Remember He penned your life from beginning to end. You will be in unison with Him in the space where you have invited Him into.

Is He on your VIP list? He should be.

NINE: IN THE QUIET SPACE



Over thinking may lead to disruptive focus. When your mind is in a state of calm, this is an indication that you are silent in words and thoughts. And when God speaks, you will hear.

But where is He to be found? 1 Kings 19:11-12 tells us that He is not in the wind, nor in the earthquake. He is instead in a gentle whisper.

As mentioned earlier, we live in a very noisy and distracted world. It could be insinuated that in all probability this technological revolution is causing our attention span to shorten and become haphazard. Have you observed this in yourself with a lack of focus or experiencing brain fog? How about isolation?

Loneliness is a very real concern, especially for the elderly or those who are living in care homes.

The busier we get, the less we are conscious of. Being caught up in matters that are nonsensical, means those in

our midst are often ignored. Smartphones have the ability to cause relationship problems.

There is chaos all around us. It is unlikely to get any better.

Many people are searching for serenity. It is not located in any particular place on all the corners of the earth because of the ongoing turmoil we are subjected to.

By sowing inner seeds of accord, there can over time be an abundant harvest of bliss and benevolence to bring about positive change for you and in you.

It is important that you schedule time to be alone with God. With Him is where you find the peace that surpasses all understanding (Philippians 4:7). It is the most sincere connection you will ever experience.

So often we hear “pray for peace” but what does it look like? If we are praying for the absence of conflict in this world we will only see that when Jesus comes back to make all things right. Is it a personal composure you seek or relational?

The word “peace” has a different interpretation for each person. What does it mean for you?

Define what it is you want.

It is absolutely possible to reach a harmonious equilibrium and that is what everyone should be pursuing with tenacity.

Being silent in prayerful meditation is when you will feel a loving breath from above. A gentle caress. A joy fulfilled. It is just beautiful. It is living water for a parched soul. You will be reenergized in the most profound way when you tap into divine resources.

Make it a habit to switch off from all activity periodically to attain a neutral mood. Immerse yourself in God's mercy and say "I am tired". "I am yours". Utterly. Completely.

Practicing mindfulness and remaining in the present moment should be a priority. By doing so, this activates stability and calms an internal storm before it becomes an uncontrollable spiral of disorder where you cannot find the exit. This action has great benefits.

The side effects are poise and repose.

Spending every day with God is paramount. He loves to be included in your life and in everything that you do. But for this to happen you need to let Him know that you long to be a part of Him and the closer you draw to Him, the closer He gets to you. "Come near to God and He will come near to you" James 4:8 (NIV).

Offer each day to Him at the outset. Allow Him to direct your path to the plans He has and deems best for you. If we are to be honest, He does know us better than we do!

TEN: HOLDING IT TOGETHER



God never walks away from you when your life turns upside down. Instead He will turn you the right side up!

We are told "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble" Psalm 46:1. (NIV). When everything is fine and dandy and going your way, you may

have less of a need for divine intervention. But when matters deteriorate, it is then that your mind becomes charged with uncertainty and you require a lifeline.

Provocations are all around us, there is no escaping them. Some tests will give you growth; others will push you to the limit where you need to reassess your endurance.

Cultivate your faith as deeply as you possibly can so you are spiritually prepared for any eventuality. Heed Watchman Nee's wise words: "The Christian experience from start to finish, is one of faith".

Oftentimes issues creep in so gradually that we barely notice them until it's too late. Be on top of problems before they intensify. Dealing with the "elephant in the room" means you ought to address your most obvious concerns first rather than avoid them.

How can you do this?

Identify and break your topics down into smaller points, come up with a strategy for solutions and implement what needs to be done. If you are able, collaborate with someone who has experience in formulating action plans in the areas that need attending.

It is best to work through a problem, not around it. You can make a comeback from a setback.

There are some valuable skills you can acquire when adhering to your agenda for resolving issues.

These include:

*Prioritising

*Increase in productivity

- *Stress management
- *Time and budget control
- *Problem solving
- *Effective communication
- *Differentiation between asset and liability

Standing before a mountain of complications scratching your head wondering how to climb over it, is an indication that you need to begin chipping at the mound to set yourself free of overwhelm. It can be done. But you need to put it in motion.

In times of distress you can run to your Father as a child in need. Release your heartache and concerns to Him. Tell Him you are experiencing difficulties and that you have no strength for conflict. God will come to your aid. He just does. "I do".

He also says "And call on me in the day of trouble; I will deliver you, and you will honour me" Psalm 50:15 (NIV).

Read the "Hall of Faith" in Hebrews 11. You will be filled with a deep sense of wonder by the stories of the great men and women who were faithful regardless of their circumstances.

Their trust in God was steadfast and consistent. We have it easy today with everything at our fingertips in comparison to biblical times.

The men and women back then laboured extensively in the most hostile conditions braving insurmountable obstacles. There were no stores on street corners to pick up groceries on the way home nor a local courier to drop off shopping bought online.

They would have been delighted to have a drive-thru to fetch a quick snack at any time of the day. Imagine if they could have swapped a donkey for a taxi via an app for transport? Or had the luxury of a smartphone to do all this!

Just think how astounded and mesmerised they would be at what the future became. What would they make of AI!

You are born into a time where everything is so much simpler (but also potentially disruptive). You are spoilt beyond recognition and because it's become the norm, you can easily overlook the marvel in it all.

This is the sad reality of failing to see the blessings that we continue to receive – even though we do not deserve them.

Maintenance in your daily prayer and your relationship with God means that when you are overwhelmed, you are in a better frame of mind because you have Him in your midst. "I am never far away".

You can always find refuge in God's grace. Walk with Him and talk to Him just as you would do with a friend who loves you unconditionally.

Jesus sits at the right hand of the Father and He advocates for you. He intercedes for you. He prays for you.

Imagine hearing this from Him: "That's the one I was telling you about" and He points at you.

ELEVEN: FAMILY TIES



On days when notions of foreboding beliefs of being abandoned and loneliness begin to envelope you, you are told "I will not leave you as orphans I will come to you" John 14:18 (NIV). There are many people who grew up without parents or family and the sense of being an outcast is a sad reality for them. I mentioned family in the beginning of the booklet but I just want to reiterate on it slightly further.

There are those who are estranged from their loved ones for various reasons. If you are in this place in your own household, rest assured that with God as your Father, you are known and called "Family" - and not only that; He has given you a limitless circle of people who you can call brothers and sisters. You are not lost in a wilderness in solitary confinement and exclusion. You have a well established ancestry.

However – and this is an important point to remember - earthly families are a gift from God. He created this kinship to carry out His will. With a caring family we have a sense of belonging, identity and in our later years, hopefully support.

But, values are fast changing. In these days and times of conflict, it is a widespread story where families have dissolved and severed their ties.

It is sad to see that the enemy satan, who is the father of all lies, can win this round because he does not want

people to love each other and he knows this is where it hurts most. In blood ties. His plan is to dismantle the chain that links relatives as one unity. Most often it is with spectacular success. And instead of healing there is hatred.

Forgiving a family member for a wrong doing, altercation, dispute or otherwise is really hard to do. We feel they should be honourable, loyal and faithful. And if that is the case, why then should we absolve them for injustices done toward us?

Unlike friends who are pardoned a lot easier and quicker, it is not so with family.

When arguments and fighting persist, this is what most often happens; everyone withdraws and silent treatment is used as the weapon of choice. That is not peace - that is anger brewing.

There is always a reason why a relationship is terminated or there is exiting. It is quite often not an overnight decision to remove oneself from family. Usually there has been a lot of thought, pain and agony of history repeating itself that may lead to the estrangement and walking away.

Perhaps there is substance abuse involved or domestic violence (which is on the increase), financial constraints, religious or sexual preferences or unemployment as examples. There is a cause to the effect. There are times when boundaries have been breached and marital affairs are taking place, thus distrust seeps in.

Some further causes can include personality clashes, boundary violations, disagreements about parenting, money disputes and even control for dominance. The list is endless.

Whatever the reasons, deficiency in effective coping tools in dealing with these issues can, without a doubt, give rise to a complete relationship breakdown. The repercussions can spark a long term ripple effect. This is a growing concern globally.

How do you feel when you perceive that you are being rejected by others? Keep this in mind; not everyone we meet is going to like us or get along with us. And vice versa. Families are no different. Recognise that we are all very dissimilar.

People are becoming a lot more aggressive than ever before and hostility can very quickly escalate to a feud where relationships are destroyed forever. And it doesn't take much for someone to reach a tipping point where the impact of their actions is dire.

If you are working through conflict challenges, it is understandable that there could be occasions when you detect being shunned through no fault of your own. It would be great if we could all gravitate towards each other in loving friendships, but that's not reality.

This does not necessarily mean that you are an invaluable person or worthless. Jesus too was ostracised but He continued on His quest to fulfil His destiny for us to have salvation.

On the other hand however, question if you might be contributing significantly in this relationship fallout. Often we refuse to acknowledge our own wrong doings and blame others. In Matthew 7:5 we are told to remove the plank from our own eye first.

Can you see this as an opportunity to make personal favourable changes that will boost your confidence in

building rapport with others and where your voice is heard? It comes down to respect from all parties involved.

Keep this verse in mind "See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called the children of God!" 1 John 3:1 (NIV). If you are loved divinely then that is really what counts most.

So while God accepts you with all your flaws there is always room for self improvement and He expects you to evolve positively.

You are responsible for what you verbalise. Heed Andy Rooney's wise advice: "Always keep your words soft and sweet, just in case you have to eat them".



Whatever your resolve is for a way forward in your family affairs, should you opt to have a meeting, be open minded to listen to what each person has to say. Come to a decision sooner rather than too late. Having a professional advisor mediate ensures both sides are heard.

TWELVE: **ABOUNDING GRACE**

With the onset of social media, it has over time evolved substantially. It can be addictive and has been linked to mental health issues. Nowadays it also functions as a platform to vent. Have you used it for that purpose? This is never a great idea because your message may be misconstrued and lost in translation.

Many people utilize social media as a surveillance camera rather than a tool of friendship where no filters are used. The positive is blocked out and emphasis is placed only on the negatives.

Properly managed, being connected has enormous advantages where you can excel tremendously. Enjoy both the online and offline world with balance.

It doesn't take much to offend someone or their feelings when you are conferring. People are quite touchy these days and if you neglect to use wisdom and choose your

words with great care, problems arise, conflict ensues and dialogue is broken down. Have you been in this situation?

Perhaps you have a shy nature and struggle to voice your opinion and you are often shouted down and so you prefer to stay quiet. This may be construed as a weakness by others and could lead to you being bullied. Work on your strengths and let it be known that you will not tolerate disrespect.
